
### **Permit Activity**

#### **Residential Permits Issued**




#### **Commercial Permits Issued**

The average response time for A Shift was 3.61 minutes; for B Shift was 3.86 minutes; and for C Shift was 3.71 minutes.


In all, personnel trained for more than 720 hours in November.






